


KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

The NACUBO Economic Models Project has developed a framework for understanding key inputs to an institution's business model. Participants will learn how they might implement the NACUBO economic framework at their institution to analyze and innovate their college or university's economic level.

CONFERENCE TRACKS

► **Accounting, Auditing & Tax** - Going beyond the traditional GASB and FASB topics, sessions focusing on Uniform Guidance and Single Audit will also be presented as well a panel discussing the IRS's renewed interest in Athletic Departments. In addition, presentations on the challenges and opportunities of Form 990T and issues important to foundations, such as split-interest agreements and charitable giving complete this track.

► **Business of Higher Education** - Sessions will include a broad range of topics: exploring ways to use your real estate to support your institution's strategic mission; the changing legal, regulatory and compliance landscape for higher education; a panel of Chief Business Officers exploring different models of public-private partnerships; and current demographic trends, such as analyzing Generation Z preferences that will impact preparing campuses to receive the new generation of students.

► **Management, HR, Tech & Data** - Explore the use of emotional intelligence as a way to engage employees and improve productivity, discuss the realities of mentoring and coaching for higher education leaders, and learn various techniques to effectively visualize and present complex data to encourage strategic action.

► **Parts & Pieces** - A track of various high-impact topics to include: construction contract analysis; the future of payment systems; innovative ways of approaching budgeting; consumer protection and collection enforcement issues related to student borrowers; and campus security.
