Closing Signals - What the Data Says!" Speaker (Nick Wallace, Director, BKD CPAs and Advisors) - The dire predictions about an upcoming tidal wave of college and university closures, along with continued media focus on the pressures facing the industry, portray a grim setting that is often too easily accepted by the public. But what does the data say? This session will provide an overview of the data and trends on higher education closures and see how the facts line up with perception. In addition, a thorough examination will be made of recent non-profit closures to recognize the common financial metrics and other indictors shared between these institutions now closed. The presentation will look at historical closure trends of higher education institutions and compare to recent years' data. The facts and data will guide observations on whether there has been a recent spike in closures or not. We will also review recent data that suggest current financial health trends for private colleges and suggest tools and processes to monitor and improve financial vitality.
